



Safe Harbor School Uniform and Dress Code Requirements

2026-2027

The heart and intent of Safe Harbor's dress code is to encourage Christian modesty within our student body while also helping to maintain a safe and secure campus environment where students are easily identifiable. Our desire is not for the dress code to feel punitive or overly restrictive, but rather to promote a respectful and positive learning environment for everyone.

To allow our administrative team to focus primarily on supporting students and families, dress code violations are addressed with limited warnings and expectations for consistent compliance. We ask parents to partner with us by reinforcing the dress code at home, so that fewer corrections are needed during the school day. By joining the Safe Harbor community, students and parents agree to support and follow the dress code outlined below.

Tops:

- Shirts are polo style in solid navy blue, baby blue, light grey, or white.
- Likewise, sweatshirts, sweaters, fleeces, etc. are to be solid navy blue, baby blue, light grey or white.
- Tops should not have words, pictures, large symbols or logos. Very small logo (two inch or less) or small detail variations will not be considered out of dress code.

Bottoms:

- Pants and mid-thigh shorts are khaki/chino style in solid khaki color or navy blue. Cargo style bottoms are permissible.
- Sweatpants or athletic style/fabric pants are not permissible.
- Girls may wear skirts in approved colors/plaid that the approved length. The colors are khaki color, navy blue, and the plaid option.
- The skirt's length should correspond to the tip of the girl's middle finger when shoulders are squared and in a relaxed position with her arms extended down her side.
- Skirts must not be rolled at the waist.

Dresses:

- Dresses solid khaki, solid navy, solid light blue or navy/khaki, plaid (matching the colors in the approved skirt).
- Jumpers must have a uniform color plain t-shirt underneath.

- Denim dresses and denim jumpers are not allowed.

Footwear:

- All shoes must be closed toe.
- Prek-5th also must have a back on their shoes. No crocs. No slides. No backless ugg.
- Grades 6-12 are allowed to wear Crocs and backless shoes, but all shoes must be closed toe (no flip flops or slides).
- Students in PE must wear appropriate athletic shoes.

Outerwear:

- Coats and jackets may be of any color or design. They are for outside use and not to be worn in class. ***Coats and jackets worn inside must meet Safe Harbor uniform colors.***

Headwear:

- Hats are not permitted in the school building/classroom, except on special occasions such as special themed dress days.

Special Provision for High School**Safe Harbor T-shirt:**

In addition to the above dress code requirements for top-wear, high schoolers may also wear the Safe Harbor t-shirt approved and designed by Safe Harbor. These shirts are available for on-demand printing and purchase at <https://tee.pub/lic/wOSbpmUyfDk>

Blue Jeans:

In addition to the above dress code requirements for bottom-wear, high schoolers will be given the additional privilege of wearing blue jeans.

- Blue jeans must be clean, full length, and properly fitted at the waist. Jean shorts, low-rise or sagging jeans, and jeans with tears or holes—whether intentional or not—are not permitted.

Corrective Action for Violations:**Elementary Students:**

- Our goal is to keep elementary students in class and focused on learning as much as possible. Consistent adherence to the dress code is important, as repeated exceptions can make it more difficult for other students to understand and follow the

established expectations, so we will reach out to parents if the Safe Harbor dress code is not followed.

Middle & High School Students:

- ***First Offense for MS/HS:*** Students will be asked to change into clothing that is dress code compliant. Students wearing inappropriate clothing that cannot be changed, will be required to sit out of class until a parent can bring new clothes.
- ***Second Offense for MS/HS:*** Parents will be asked to bring a change of clothes. Students will be asked to sit out of class until new clothes arrive.
- ***Third Offense for MS/HS:*** Parents will be asked to bring a change of clothes. Students will be asked to sit out of class until new clothes arrive. A meeting with parents and students may be required.
